1. The Minor in Anthropology and International Development is designed for students who seek to understand human societies, cultures, and development processes. It provides interdisciplinary insights into the study of humanity while addressing critical issues related to international development, equipping students with analytical skills and knowledge to engage in global challenges.
2. To apply for minor, students must have a minimum of GPA 2.7 or higher in their major.
3. To earn the Minor degree in Anth & ID, students must earn a total of **42 credits**.
4. As **an additional recommendation**, we highly encourage students to participate in research, field activities, and projects organized by the program. Engaging in these hands-on opportunities will enhance your practical skills, deepen your understanding of key concepts, and provide valuable real-world experience in the fields of Anth & ID.
5. All courses should have passing grades to be accepted. No written and oral exams as well as writing senior theses are required to receive the minor.
