Why?

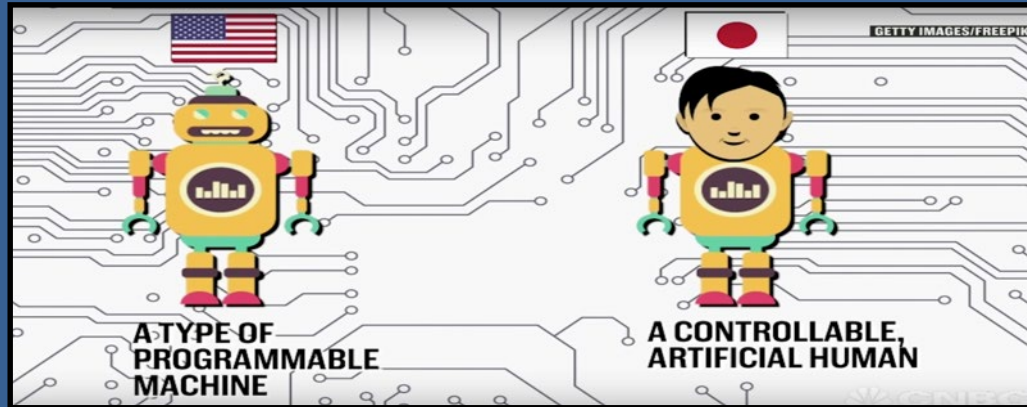
Japan's Depopulation and Aging problems exist. There are a fewer workers support an aging population means poor economic growth.

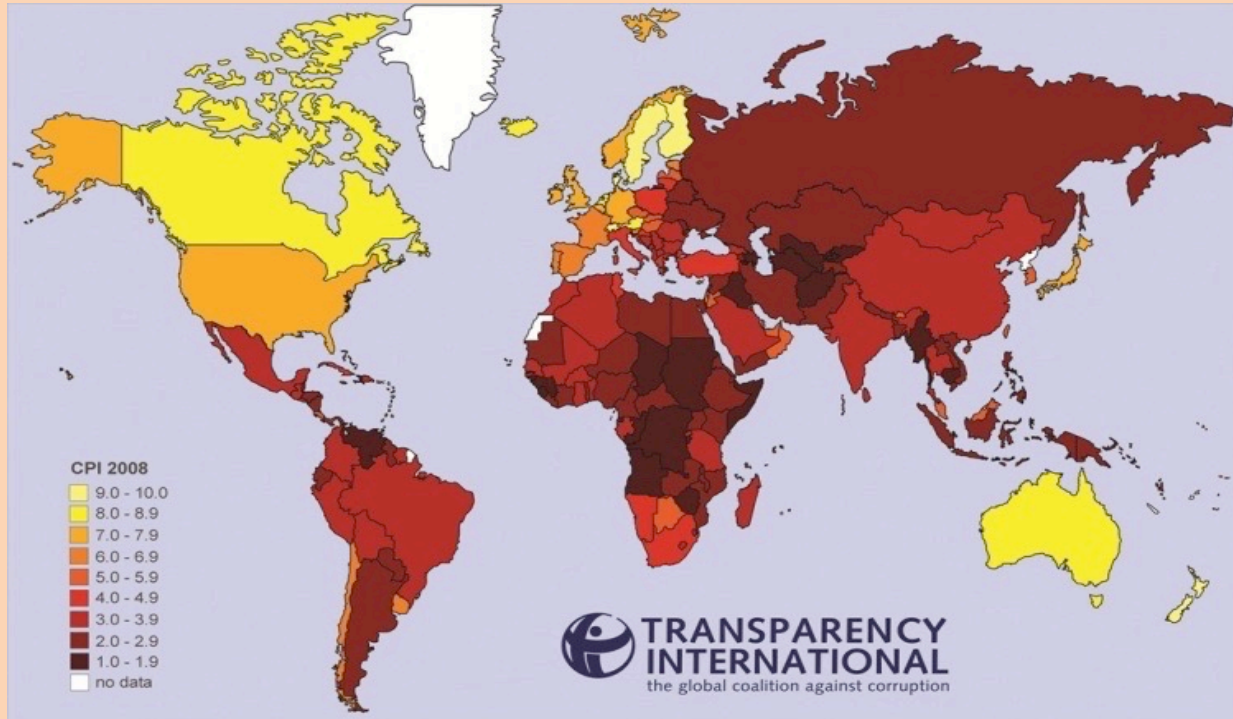
