2021 CENTRAL ASIAN JOURNALISM VIRTUAL INSTITUTE (CAJVI)

On Monday, March 29, Meridian International Center and American University of Central Asia launched the first Central Asian Journalism Virtual Institute, funded by the U.S. Department State. As travel restrictions continue due to the COVID-19 pandemic, this innovative virtual program connects young journalists across borders through live sessions and online teamwork.

Opening the event, the **U.S. Ambassador to the Kyrgyz Republic Donald Lu** stated, "I believe the people of Central Asia value investigative journalism and freedom of the media. Central Asia faces tremendous challenges to democracy, almost on a daily basis, and it's independent journalism, together with civil society, that defends democracy against those who wish to establish dictatorships. It's all of you who give me hope in the future of that democracy."

Closing remarks on Friday, April 23 were given by the **U.S. Ambassador** to **Uzbekistan Daniel Rosenblum and President and COO of Meridian International Center - Lee Satterfield. Director of Institute, Aizhana Dzhumalieva**, mentioned that, "Central Asian Journalism Institute is umbrella organization unites journalists from Kazakhstan, the Kyrgyz Republic, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, and Uzbekistan, and any common projects across region, especially for Media and journalism are crucial and we hope will bring positive changes".

CAJVI 2021 was hybrid, and Institute Director Aizhana Dzhumalieva and filmmaker Adilet Karzhoev visited Dushanbe, Tashkent, and Almaty with Leadership workshops and masterclasses on video production and photography.

GENDER AND MEDIA CLASS TOGETHER WITH UN WOMEN & SCHOOL OF DATA

On May 18, there was a presentation of the final projects of our graduate students in the framework of the course "Gender and Media", which was conducted in cooperation with UN Women and the School of Data.

The results of the work done were multimedia data-based articles on the selected gender issue in the context of Central Asia.

"Together with the School of Data and the UN Women, we have developed modules on gender statistics for teaching in journalism faculties. Implemented and tested as part of my Master of Journalism course" Gender and Media", which I teach at AUCA Journalism and Mass Communications department some years.

Today my students made presentations on their multimedia articles (longreads and even quizzes), which we will soon post on online platforms. I hope similar disciplines will appear in other universities of Kyrgyzstan in the near future. "- shares the initiator of the project and our faculty professor Nurzhamal Karamoldoeva



For me personally, the conference was useful not only for new information, I want to note that for a journalist, it is probably very important to understand what is happening in the international arena, what specialists, professionals who are at the top of their careers talk about and teach. It is very pleasant to observe such people, even through the zoom. Listen to them, analyze their thoughts. From the lectures I listened to, I want to highlight a lecture from Paul Vixie on "Finding the story: Using DNS search for investigative journalism", Rachelle Solomon and Caitlyn Ralph on the topic: "Journalist Studio tools". And also Alberto Cairo on the topic: "So you want to visualize data?" I really like his work. And it was a great pleasure to listen to this person in real time. Examples of the viewed data visualizations form the viewability, which is very important in our profession. Thank you again for this opportunity!"

"Together with the other students, I have received access not only to recordings, but also to the library of federal databases, which is a plethora of study materials and other resources. As a librarian, and as a teaching assistant, I can now offer and use these resources to the students and the faculty. Additionally, there is an access to the IRE online store, with a possibility to purchase exclusive study materials -- an option that I might also offer to students of faculty wishing to develop their course".

JOURNALISM MEDIA MENTORSHIP PROGRAM (JMMP)

The JMMP program is designed for JMC students to get connections with the industry while they are still studying. Selected students matched with mentors who are media professionals from different areas like reporting, multimedia and communications. They developed informal professional relationships via a series of press brunches where they could exchange ideas, get inspired and establish new connections.

Also, each student mentee worked on a professional project that will be published until July 2021, under the supervision of his mentor. The mentor assisted a student as an editor and provided feedback during the program.

The project started with a kick-off press brunch. Later on, selected fellows worked on their projects. Several more meetings were scheduled to encourage exchange between the participants. By the end of the program, students will have work published and a professional connection for their future. The event ended with a final meeting and discussion about the students' projects.

Through the call and personal invitations 9 participants were selected. Among them 4 representatives of TOP media professionals in Kyrgyzstan and 5 students of the Journalism and Mass Communications department.
