Programme content

MODULE 1 (full-time)

3 weeks at the American University of Central Asia (AUCA) in Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan & 2 weeks online

- Analyse the complex implementation of development processes in fragile contexts
- Rethink projects using strategic management tools
- Acquire methodological skills to carry out an applied research
- Get critical perspectives on contemporary peace-and-security concerns

MODULE 2 (part-time) - *Executive Master only*

4 months at your place of work with e-learning

- Conduct data collection/analysis and write your professional thesis (topic relevant to your work)
- Attend elective e-learning courses on different topics

MODULE 3 (full-time) - *Executive Master only*

2.5 weeks in international Geneva

- Strengthen your leadership skills (mediation, negotiations, foresight, communication)
- Present your professional thesis in public
- Participate in work sessions with public administrations, international organisations and NGOs
