Recovering Forgotten Conflicts is a photography project launched in 2014 to help tell the stories of war victims through photos and to attract the attention of humanitarian organizations. With the support of Bard CCE from 2016, RFC has hosted an annual summer workshop led by award-winning international photographers for university students to learn about photography, critical issues in Afghanistan, and the potential for the art of photography to raise awareness through an artistic movement.

Outcomes

Since 2014, some 500+ victims of war have participated in the project. The RFC volunteer team has grown from a team of 5 to 36 active members across Afghanistan who are actively working on RFCs' projects: developing more projects such as APVT within RFC. Also, RFC has ongoing projects with Bard Center for Civic Engagement, Afghanistan Government Media Center, and International Committee of the Red Cross, United Nations, and U.S. Embassy Kabul.

Vision

RFCs' vision is to grow membership all over Afghanistan that can expand activities from Kabul to other Afghan provinces. RFC members are working to create a bigger space and have more students participate in the annual workshops that include students from other countries with similar geopolitical issues.
