

Bilim Nuskasy: Skill Development Workshop for Children with Disabilities in Rural Villages of Kyrgyzstan



About Us

In Toktogul region of Kyrgyzstan, there are more than 300 children with different disabilities. The local government does not offer enough special support or resources to provide services to the children in the region. Schools and public places are not built to accommodate their needs nor are they intended for their use. As a result, most of the children with limited mobility spend all their time at home. Such isolation can lead to feelings of abandonment by the society that should support them. To address this issue, we provide volunteer-led workshops focused on hard and soft skills that include technology, handicraft, English language, leadership, and community improvement projects.



Mission

To empower children with disabilities in the rural villages of Toktogul, Kyrgyzstan by expanding their knowledge and skills through a variety of interactive workshops.

Target group

The number of workshop participants ranges from 12-18. Participants are school students of ages 9-16, who have physical impairments and chronic diseases except cognitive impairment.

Goal Statement

To expand our program for children in all seven villages of the Toktogul region. We are planning

to host a panel that features accomplished leaders with disabilities to help model a path for an enriching future. We will launch a publicity campaign in the Toktogul region highlighting successes and expand the reach of our work using local media and newspapers.



Impact

- Students break stereotypes about their disabilities by completing community improvement projects.
- Parents actively participate in their children's academic and social development.
- Children are empowered to get education and set goals.
