
Keep your positive attitude to learning, keep dreaming, and stay motivated!

While discussing the texts we read in our



Professors being

open to schedule office hours and WARC providing peer tutors was a surprising revelation to me, and definitely something that eased the struggle of learning.

For the first time I find myself forward to the rest of the semester. Whether it is the freedom, the community, or being treated like an adult that appeals so much to me, not once have I looked back at my school in reminiscence.
